UCL Cancer Institute draws together over 300 scientists working together to develop world-class basic and translational cancer research.

This Clinical Research Training Fellowship position offers high quality basic science and translational research experience to a suitably motivated clinician in training who seeks to consider combining a clinical or pathology career in cancer with scientific research. This post, funded by the Tom Prince Cancer Trust www.tomprince.co.uk, will enable a Clinical Research Training Fellow to obtain a widely varied laboratory-based experience and generate sufficient original research to apply for funding to apply for a PhD studentship.

The post holder will work with a multidisciplinary team of scientists and clinicians to understand in depth the development and progression of osteosarcoma. This will be achieved by studying comprehensively a prospective cohort of patients longitudinally and will benefit from the 100,000 Genomes Project.

The post holder will contribute to the initiation of the overall project, but will also have a specific project with aims and objectives allowing development of skills including bioinformatics, statistics and an in depth understanding of cancer biology.

The primary supervisors will be Prof Adrienne M Flanagan, Dr Nischalan Pillay and Dr Sandra Strauss.

This post is funded for 12 months in the first instance.

The successful applicant should hold full GMC registration, have a medical degree and have completed their Foundation Training and preferably core training or specialist training. The post holder will have experience in clinical oncology and patient care.
